FAMILY CONCERNS

As you may recall, Mike's father died in April of 2006 just before we returned to begin our last term. Since then, Mike's mother's health has declined. Early in September of this year, she was hospitalized, and then spent three weeks in a rehabilitation center. On September 24, after we had purchased our tickets to return to Peru, my 90-year old mother went into the hospital with heart and bowel problems. She is now in a rehabilitation facility. It remains to be seen if she will be able to return to her home and live there alone. The last few weeks before we left were difficult, to say the least, but we are thankful for the great care our mothers got while in the hospital. Thank you so much for your prayers for our mothers! Please continue to pray for them, and for our siblings, friends, and relatives who are caring for them.
